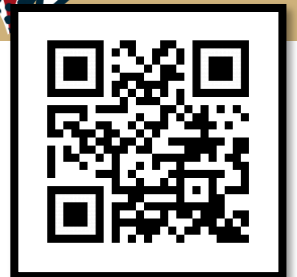

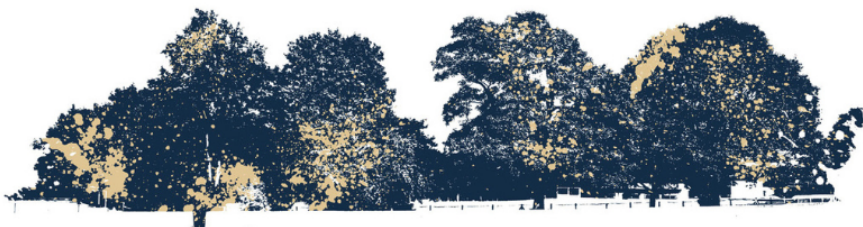

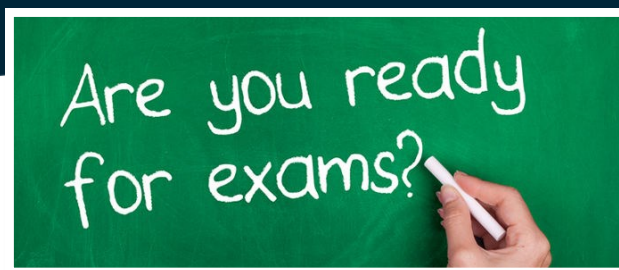
The Year 13 Prom is at Statham Lodge Hotel on **Thursday 11th July**.

Year 13 send off!

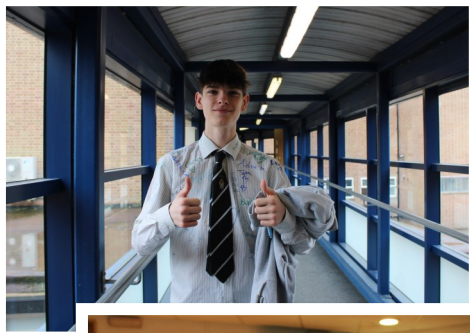
On Friday 24th May we held our celebration day for our Year 13 students.

Economics Summer Schools 2024

Whether a student's interest focuses on international development, business management, or the ups and downs of financial markets, attendees at the Economics Summer School will have the opportunity to really test their academic mettle and prepare for university applications, as well as meeting peers who share their interests and ambitions. The material will be challenging, but the atmosphere is relaxed, with small groups, plenty of discussion, debate, and opportunities for students to shape the direction of classes. Both online and in-person options are available.

- **Economics Summer School (in-person)**

29th July to 2nd August

The Economics Summer School will give students the opportunity to study a range of economics which is wider than that available at school and in a style which encourages active and critical engagement.

- **Introduction to Economics (online)**

12–16th August

This course will offer those students without any previous experience of studying economics a taste of both micro and macro economics. An excellent grounding in the basics, designed to build confidence and inspiration for future study.

- **Economics: Growth, Development and Inequalities** (online)

19–21st August

This course will examine how and why economies grow at different rates, what governments can do in terms of economic policy, and the impact on citizens of different distributions of wealth and income within and between economies.

- **Money, Capital and Financial Markets** (online)

27–29th August

In this exciting 3-day course we will explore the inner workings of financial markets, the theoretical underpinnings of different systems of money and capital, and what can happen when those systems fail.



The in-person courses will be held at Woburn House, Bloomsbury, Central London in July and August. Please note that accommodation must be arranged independently if required. The live online courses in August are for those who prefer to attend from home. You can find full details of all courses [here](#).

Course fees range from £195–745 depending on the course subject, format, and length. For students who would have difficulty paying the course costs, there are a limited number of bursaries of up to 90%.
