# LOWER SCHOOL

## Life Programme

Our last extended Life Programme of the year is on **Thursday 18th July**. Key Stage 3 students will study the following topics.

Year 7: What is the link between jobs and money? In the last session focusing on finances, students will explore different types of work and different ways that people can be paid for the jobs they do. This will also consider the amount that different jobs are paid.

Year 8: Digital Literacy – How money can make you feel. Our Year 8 students will be exploring how our relationship with money can change and indeed change us. The resources, provided by MoneySense, look at the link between money and mood and how debt can damage our wellbeing. Students will explore some case studies that will help build confidence in dealing with money issues.

**Year 9: Judges and Juries**. The final Year 9 Life Programme looks at the British legal system and the role judges and juries play within it. Students will consider their own attitudes to crime and punishment as well as gain knowledge of the adult and youth court systems. The session ends by looking at sentencing and some circumstances where sentencing may be reduced.
