Concern regarding unsafe driving and parking near school

Life Programme

Our next extended Life Programme is on **Tuesday 24th September**. Key Stage 3 students will study the following topics.

Year 7: Transition and New Starts
Year 7 are focused on their move from Primary to Secondary school. In the last Life Programme

session, they looked at the feelings we have when we have to make big changes in our lives. On Tuesday, they will be focusing on travelling safely to school. This will also look at how we travel safely around Lymm. Year 7 will then (like the rest of the year groups) move onto the Relationships and Sex education module for the rest of the half term. They will start with looking at healthy relationships and how to form positive relationships with their peers.

Year 8: Influences on Relationships and Consent

Year 8 are continuing their Relationships and Sex education module with a focus in the next couple of weeks on what influences the relationships we have and how they can change, as well as how we can avoid making assumptions about consent. We look here at how we can spot when consent for any behaviour is given and how to act appropriately when it is not.

Year 9: Consent

Year 9 will be spending the next couple of sessions trying to unpick the issue of consent within relationships. Firstly, they will explore what capacity to consent actually means and how we know when someone is able to give consent or not. The second session will be about how we can see when consent has been given and recognising situations where it is important to gain consent.

Our next extended Life Programme is on **Tuesday 24th September**. Key Stage 4 students will study the following topics.

Year 10: Consent and the Law

As part of the Relationships and Sex Education curriculum, Year 10 will be focusing on the rule of law when it comes to consent. Exploring what the law says around issues of consent and rape, and how we can see when the law has been broken. They will be able to look at a scenario and apply the law to it. This will be followed up with a look at some of the issues that are thrown up around consent and rape and how we can approach them maturely. They will also be able to challenge some preconceived ideas around these issues.

• Year 11: Exploring ideas around Family

Building on the last session on making long-term commitments, Year 11 will spend the next few sessions looking at ideas around family and the relationships we have within them. We will look at what family means in the 21st Century and explore conflict within families, and how we can help resolve these as well as support those within our family units.
