Life Programme

Our next extended Life Programme is on **Tuesday 22nd October**. Key Stage 3 students will study the following topics.

- **Year 7** students will be looking at the physical and emotional changes that take place during puberty. They will look at how to cope with these changes and how best to understand these changes. We will look at the common changes that anyone can experience as well as those linked to biology.
- **Year 8** students will have their introductory session in contraception, which will be developed on in Year 9. Students will explore what contraception is as well as some of the most common forms. They will then look at some 'talking heads' scenarios to explore some of the issues and attitudes to contraception. This session will help to gauge what students know but also learn what support is available.
- **Year 9** will have their follow-up session on contraception which they started in Year 8. This session will go into more detail around the importance of staying safe in intimate relationships and how contraception fits into this. This session will also help students evaluate the effectiveness of different types of contraception in keeping people safe.

'How to help your child revise' evening – Thursday 17th October

The 'How to help your child revise' evening for Year 11 parents will take place on **Thursday 17th October** at 6–7pm in the Main Hall. This will include information on effective revision strategies, an update on support in place for Year 11 students, as well as top tips from our Heads of English, Maths and Science.

Life Programme

Our next extended Life Programme is on **Tuesday 22nd October**. Key Stage 4 students will study the following topics.

- **Year 10:** As part of their RSE module, students will have a one-off session focusing on the impact that pornography can have. This is led by Mr Dobson in the Hall and aims to explore not only the impact that pornography has on individuals but also their relationships. We look to challenge some of the 'scripts' that pornography suggests to us and also the impact the industry has on those who work within it.
- **Year 11:** After a last-minute change to the session running order, students had a session exploring fertility last time. This is going to be followed by a session on pregnancy outcomes. This will explore the emotional impact these outcomes can have as well as equip students with some knowledge around medical support and interventions. We also explore these outcomes looking at scenarios where we can give advice and discuss options in a variety of situations.
