The trip was accompanied by informative seminars about the Holocaust, including the chance to hear from a Holocaust survivor.

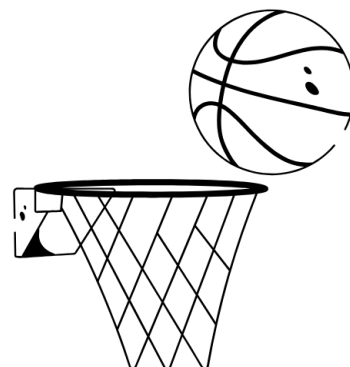

LSEUPR Essay Competition

Deadline for submissions: Monday 11th November

The annual London School of Economics' Undergraduate Political Review (LSEUPR) Essay Competition aims to encourage Year 12 and 13 students to explore the field of Political Science and undertake university-style essay writing. It also presents itself as an ideal extra-curricular experience for students wishing to include in their UCAS personal statements. Candidates are invited to submit an essay in response to one of the following questions:

- 'How might AI technologies influence the fairness and security of elections in 2024, and what should be done to mitigate potential risks?'
- 'Collective political action nowadays is vain and pointless. Even directly elected officials have long been disconnected from the people's will.'
- 'Corruption, embezzlement, fraud, these are all characteristics which exist everywhere. It is regrettably the way human nature functions, whether we like it or not.' (Allan Greenspan)

The essay should be no more than 1000 words long, including all in-text citations, footnotes and headings but excluding title and bibliography.

This year's prize is a £100 Amazon Voucher, a certificate, your essay published in the LSEUPR blog, and the opportunity to attend and to present your essay at the LSEUPR Annual Conference 2025.

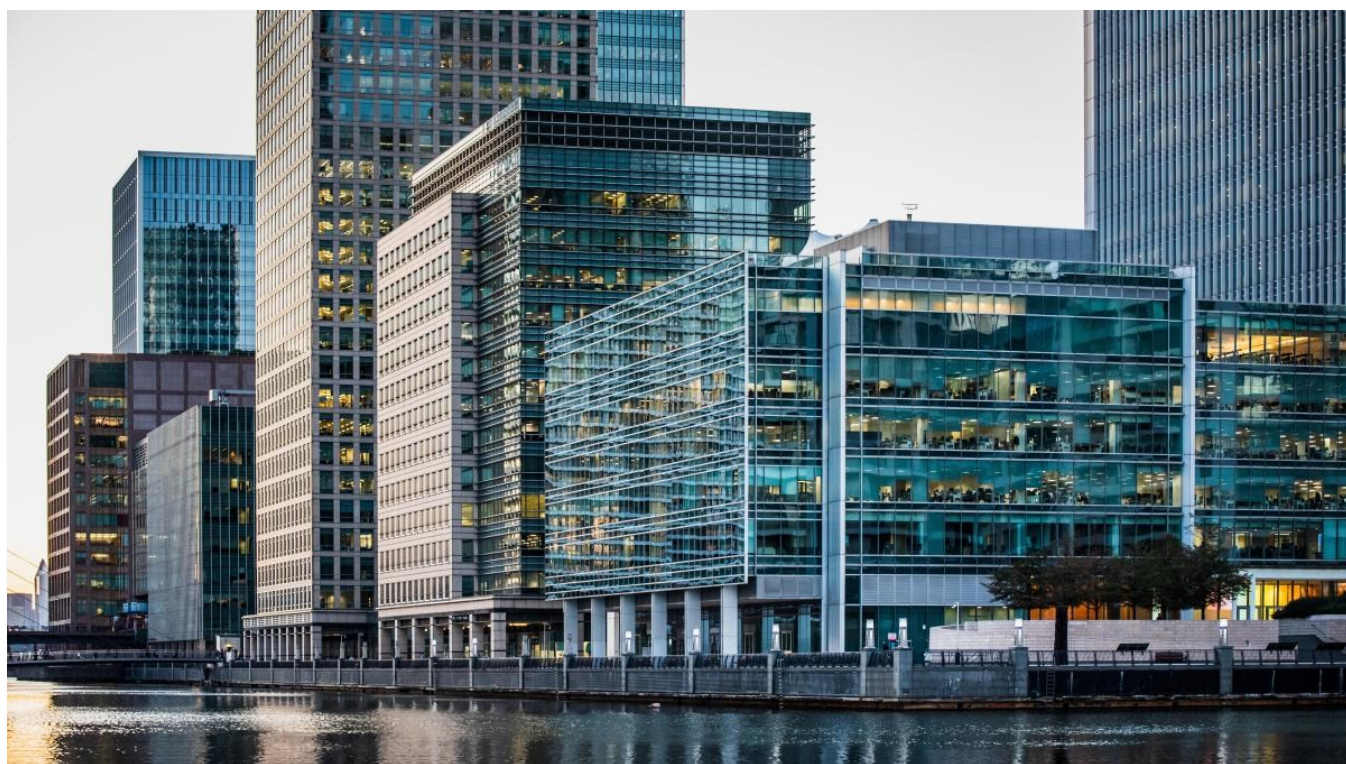
