The Cambridge Centre for Animal Rights Law organises an annual essay competition in the field of animal rights law. The aim of this competition is to encourage students to explore the fascinating questions that animals rights raise, and to discuss these questions in an original piece of writing that may inspire them to engage further with the topic in the future.

This year, the Essay Competition is on the title: 'Is rights of nature a useful framework for giving rights to animals?' Discuss.

The competition has two categories: one for university students (including graduates and PhD candidates) and one for secondary school students. The latter is for anyone at high school, college or similar. Essays must be no longer than 1000 words (including footnotes but excluding bibliography). A Winning Commendation and up to two Special Commendations will be sent to the winners in this category, and prizes of £250 will be sent to the winners' schools.


