

AVOIDING BURNOUT BEFORE EXAMS

As exams approach, it's tempting to cram, but effective studying is about consistency, not last-minute panic.

Pacing your studies means breaking your revision into manageable chunks rather than overwhelming yourself with long, exhausting sessions.

Create a realistic revision timetable that balances subjects, includes short breaks, and allows time for reviewing weaker areas. Techniques like spaced repetition and active recall can help reinforce learning without overload.

Remember, rest is just as important as study – burnout can harm your performance more than missing an extra hour of revision.

By planning ahead and maintaining a steady pace, you'll walk into your exams feeling prepared, focused, and in control.





The academic training and will be provided by the University of Law and you will be required to attend training 1 day per week. The course will be funded by the government Levy, but we as your employer will pay the £3,000 top up, so you end up with no student debt. Salary is yet to be confirmed but will be in excess of minimum wage. Any job offer will be subject to meeting the entry requirements set by the University of Law.




Each day will be a combination of live webinars and time for students to complete a real workplace task through the Courses tool.
