Life Programme

Below are the topics our KS3 students will study in the next two extended Form times. Please continue to discuss these topics at home with your child, as open and supportive conversations help reinforce learning, build confidence and encourage young people to make safe, informed and healthy choices.

Thursday 21st May

- **Year 7: Healthy Sleep**
Students will learn about the importance of healthy sleep habits, including how sleep affects physical health, emotional wellbeing, concentration and academic performance. They will explore ways to improve sleep routines and manage screen time before bed.
- **Year 8: Mental Health and Body Image**
Students will discuss mental health and positive body image, exploring how social media, peer pressure and stereotypes can influence self-esteem. The lesson encourages resilience, self-confidence and strategies for maintaining good mental wellbeing.
- **Year 9: Introduction to Gambling**
Students will be introduced to the risks associated with gambling, including online gambling, gaming features, and the impact gambling can have on finances, relationships and mental health. They will begin to develop strategies for making safe and informed choices.

Thursday 4th June

- **Year 7: Informal Assessment**
Students will complete an informal assessment to review and reflect on the knowledge and skills they have developed throughout this year's Extended Life Programme. This will help inform future curriculum planning.
- **Year 8: Cannabis, Alcohol and Vaping**
Students will learn about the health risks and legal implications associated with cannabis, alcohol and vaping. The lesson will focus on informed decision-making, peer pressure and strategies to stay safe.
- **Year 9: Gambling continued**
Students will continue their learning about gambling through discussion and video content, exploring the real-life consequences of gambling addiction and ways to seek support if needed.

Life Programme

Below are the topics our KS4 students will study in the next two extended Form times. Please continue to discuss these topics at home with your child, as open and supportive conversations help reinforce learning, build confidence and encourage young people to make safe, informed and healthy choices.

Thursday 21st May

- **Year 10: Human Rights**
Students will explore the concept of human rights, examining why they are important and how they protect individuals across the world. They will discuss fairness, equality and responsibilities within society.
- **Year 11: Money, the Economy and Tax**
Students will learn about taxation, the economy and how money is used within society. The lesson will help students understand payslips, different types of tax, and how taxes contribute to public services.

Thursday 4th June

- **Year 10: Drugs, Alcohol and Risky Behaviours**
Students will examine the risks linked to drugs, alcohol and unsafe behaviours. The session aims to support students in recognising risk, making responsible choices, and understanding how to access help and support.

Personal Development Update

This half term our social responsibility theme is **Resilience**. It is really important to us that our students have the necessary skills to cope positively when faced with challenging and difficult situations which they may face. This is even more crucial for our KS4 and KS5 students who are currently completing examinations across their subjects. Whilst this can feel overwhelming and daunting, we want our students to feel confident that they can overcome any challenge life may bring. Through our assembly schedule and Form time programme, we will be reminding them of how these skills can be developed and applied.
