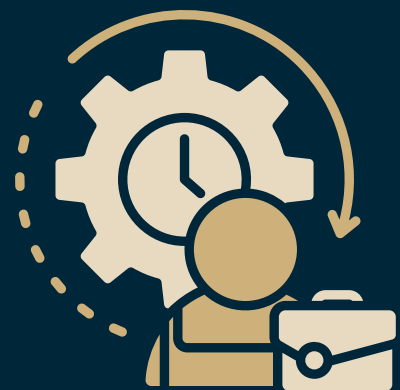

## Y12 WORK EXPERIENCE

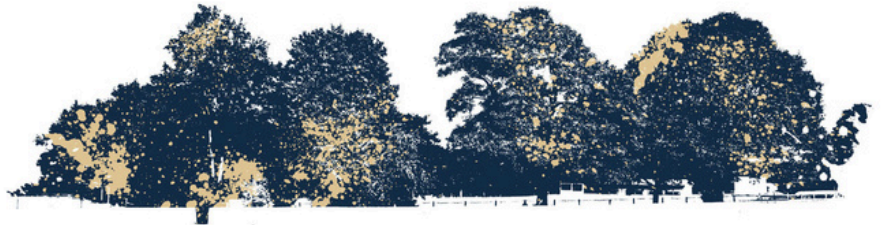
This week, Year 12 students will be on their work experience placement. Students are expected to take responsibility for preparing themselves professionally. See p.9 for more information.

## Year 12 Work Experience

As part of their Key Stage 5 work experience placement, students are expected to take responsibility for preparing themselves professionally. Before the placement begins, students should research the organisation, understand its purpose and the role they will be undertaking, and ensure they know their working hours, location, and travel arrangements. Students should dress appropriately, arrive punctually, communicate professionally, and demonstrate a positive attitude throughout the placement. They should also prepare any questions they may wish to ask employers, set personal goals for what they hope to learn, and be ready to reflect on the skills and experiences they gain. Work experience is an excellent opportunity to develop employability skills, build confidence, and gain valuable insight into future career pathways.

A member of staff will be in touch with your employers throughout the week to touch base and answer any queries or concerns you or the employer may have.

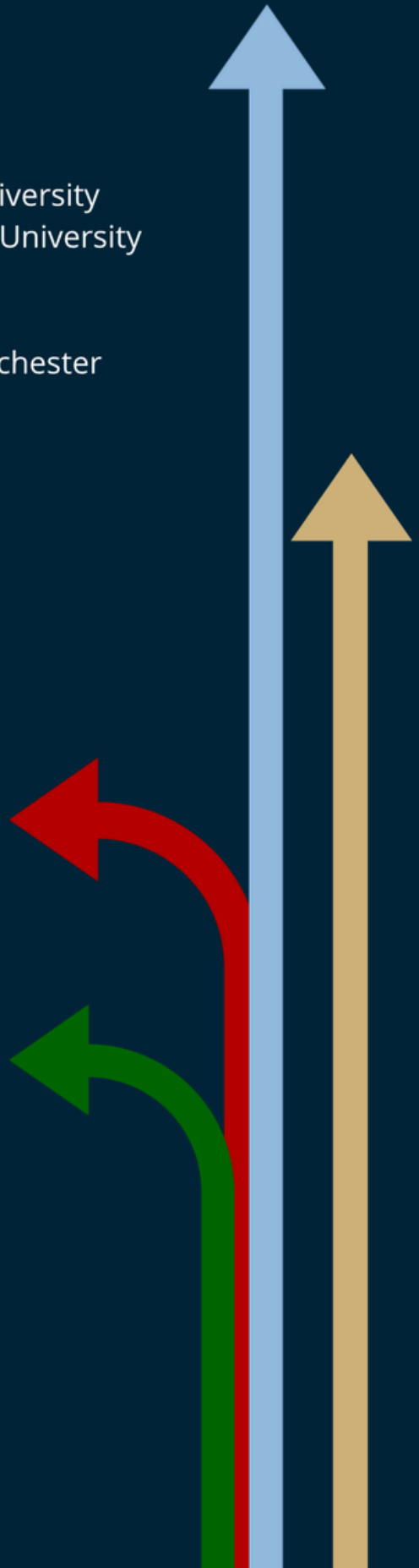

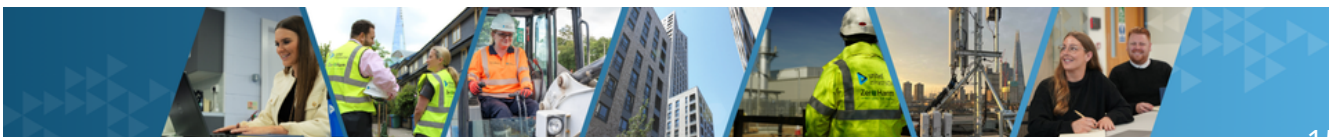

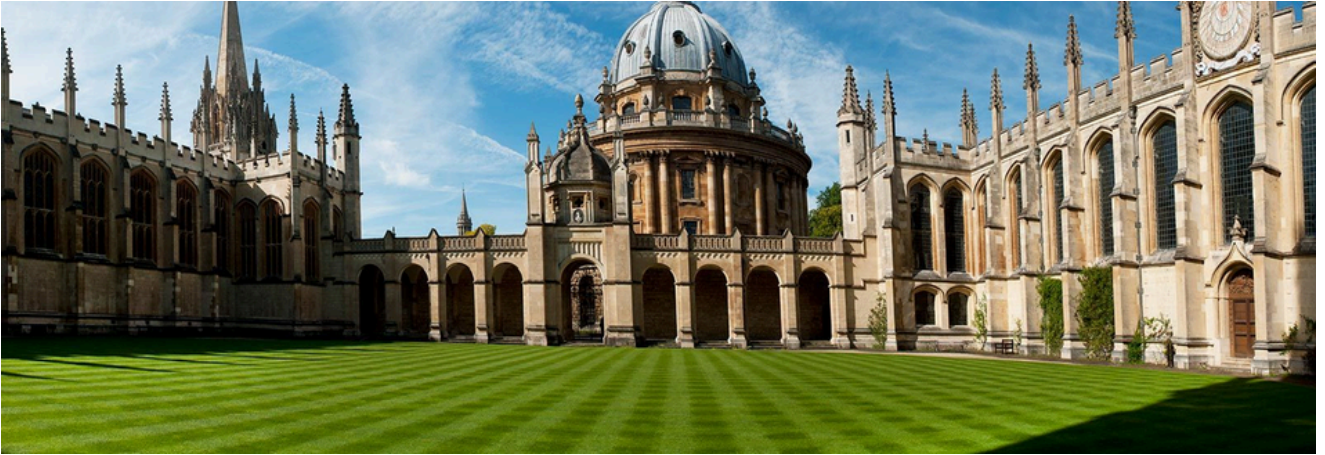
