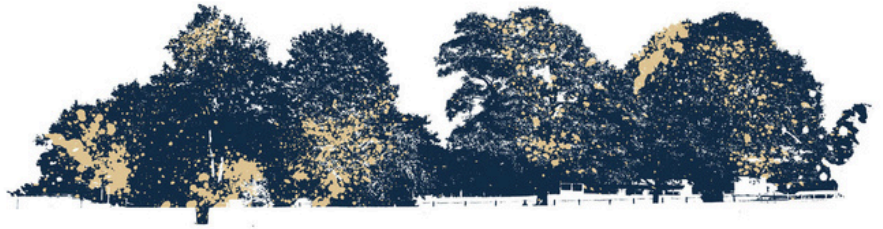

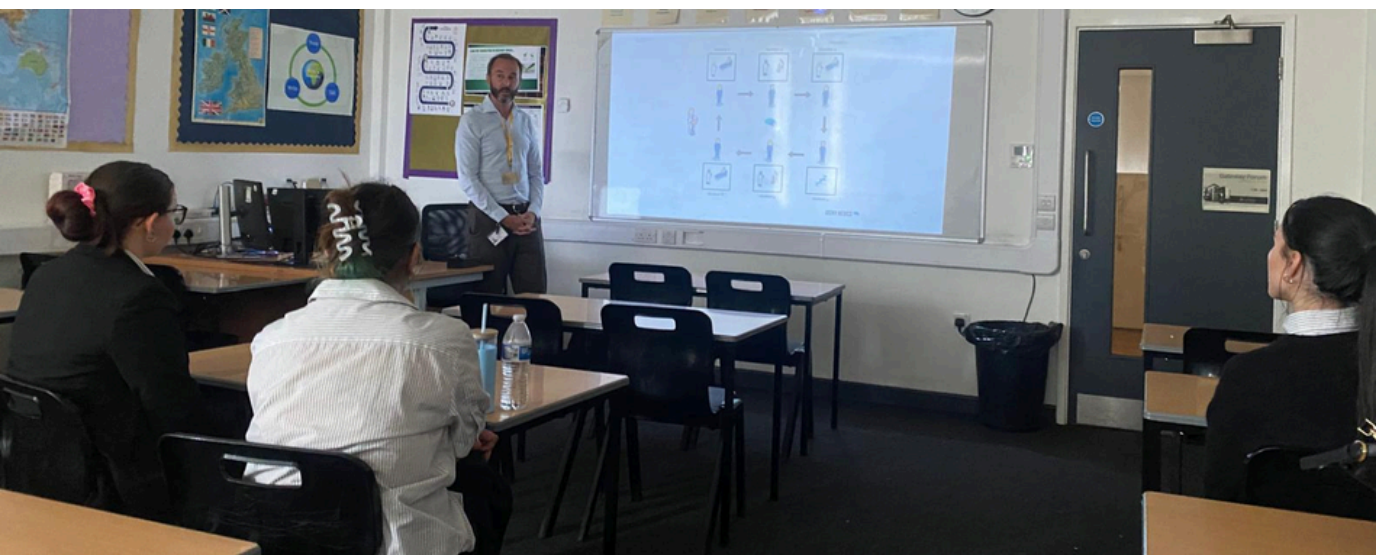
Expert advice for aspiring medics

Students considering careers in Medicine were delighted to welcome Professor Dan Horner, Consultant in Emergency Medicine and Intensive Care at the Northern Care Alliance NHS Foundation Trust and Honorary Clinical Professor at the Manchester Academic Health Sciences Centre, for an invaluable interview preparation session.

Drawing on his extensive experience as both a practising clinician in A&E and the trauma unit, and as a university lecturer, Professor Horner guided students through the medical school interview process, with a particular focus on Multiple Mini Interviews (MMIs). He explored a variety of elements, including types of ethical and social media-related scenarios that applicants may encounter, offering practical advice on how to approach challenging questions with confidence and professionalism.

Students also received guidance on making a strong first impression, communicating effectively during interview stations and demonstrating the qualities medical schools are looking for in future doctors. Professor Horner's approachable style, expert knowledge and practical insights made for a highly engaging session, leaving students feeling better prepared and more confident as they begin their medical school applications.

Alumni inspire students with careers in media

Our Year 12 students were delighted to welcome back former students Megan O'Driscoll (Class of 2022) and Harvey Mountford (Class of 2015) for an inspiring talk on careers in the media industry.

Drawing on their own experiences, Megan and Harvey explored the wide range of opportunities available across film, television and digital media, highlighting career pathways including apprenticeships, traineeships, freelancing, networking and university. They also introduced students to the [ScreenSkills Jobs Board](#), showcasing the huge variety of roles that exist behind the scenes in the creative industries.

Using examples from their own work, including a Fulham FC advert and a documentary exploring the creation of safe online spaces for women, they demonstrated how creative ideas become professional productions. They also emphasised the importance of resilience, sharing how acclaimed cinematographer Roger Deakins received 13 Oscar nominations before finally winning on his 14th.

To round off the session, students put their new knowledge into practice by experimenting with composition and camera framing techniques, making for an interactive and enjoyable end to a fascinating talk.

Megan and Harvey have kindly offered to return for future sessions, giving us the flexibility to schedule another visit at a point that best supports the Year 12 curriculum, including around the coursework launch. It is a fantastic opportunity for students to hear first-hand from former students who are thriving in such a competitive and exciting industry.

Exploring Apprenticeships with BDO & Accenture

As part of our Futures Friday programme, all Year 12 students heard from two apprentices working in leading global organisations. The session provided valuable insight into apprenticeship opportunities, the application process and what it is really like to begin a professional career straight after Sixth Form. Students also gained practical advice on developing the skills and resilience needed to succeed.

Abigail Mitchell – Risk Advisory Services, BDO

Abigail Mitchell shared her experience of joining BDO's Risk Advisory Services team and gave students an excellent introduction to apprenticeships in the professional services sector. She explained how to find apprenticeship opportunities, outlined the application process and described the range of roles available at BDO. Students also learned about a typical working week, the responsibilities and skills required to succeed, the differences between apprenticeships and university, and the value of virtual work experience and insight programmes when exploring future career options.

Shalon Gallagher – Cloud Engineer, Accenture

Shalon Gallagher spoke about her apprenticeship journey as a Cloud Engineer at Accenture, offering students an insight into working in the technology industry. She discussed the global brands she has worked with, her day-to-day role, and how her career has developed since starting her apprenticeship. Shalon also talked students through the application process she experienced, the challenges she has overcome and the many benefits of combining work with professional qualifications, demonstrating how apprenticeships can provide an exciting route into a rewarding career.

CAMBRIDGE CHEMISTRY CHALLENGE

We are delighted to celebrate the outstanding achievements of our Year 12 students in this year's Cambridge Chemistry Challenge.

The Cambridge Chemistry Challenge is a prestigious national competition designed to stretch and inspire talented young chemists. This year, more than 15,000 Year 12 students from across the UK took part, tackling a challenging paper that tests problem-solving, application of chemical knowledge, and scientific thinking beyond the A Level specification.

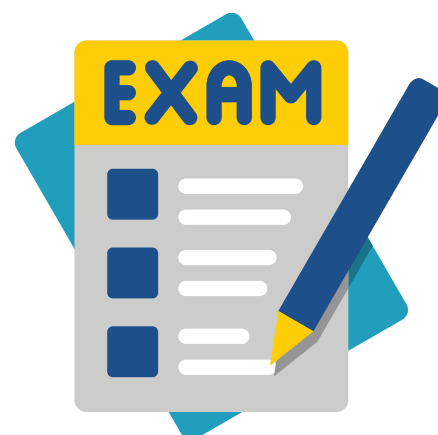

Year 12 Mock Exams

These assessments provide an important opportunity to identify strengths, highlight areas for development and prepare effectively for future external examinations. We encourage parents and carers to discuss the results with their child, celebrating successes while helping them to reflect on any subjects where further improvement is needed. Students should use the feedback provided by their teachers to create a focused revision plan, attend any intervention sessions offered, and seek support promptly if they are unsure about any aspect of their learning. Mock exams are designed to inform next steps rather than define final outcomes, and many students make significant progress between their mock examinations and their final results through consistent effort and effective revision.

An outstanding success!

This year's Year 12 Work Experience Programme has once again been an outstanding success, with employers across a diverse range of industries praising the attitude, professionalism and commitment shown by our students. [Click here](#) to view the full list of organisations who have provided work placement opportunities for our students, giving them the opportunity to develop valuable workplace skills while gaining first-hand experience of their chosen career paths.

Throughout the week, students impressed employers with their enthusiasm, resilience and willingness to embrace new challenges. Whether supporting engineering projects, contributing to marketing campaigns, assisting in schools and healthcare settings, helping to deliver community initiatives or working alongside business and technology professionals, they demonstrated excellent communication, teamwork, initiative and problem-solving skills. Many employers commented on the remarkable progress students made during the week, particularly in growing in confidence, becoming more independent and taking increasing responsibility for their work.

The feedback we received was overwhelmingly positive. One employer described a student as *"a real credit to the school"*, while another said it had been *"an absolute pleasure"* to host their placement student. Students were praised for being *"polite, punctual and showing a strong work ethic"*, *"keen to learn"*, and *"asking thoughtful questions"* that demonstrated genuine curiosity and engagement. One employer commented that their student *"embraced every opportunity with enthusiasm, maturity and a genuine willingness to learn"*, while another simply said *"She has been an absolute star"*.

Several organisations remarked that students had become valued members of their teams, with comments such as "*The team will miss him next week!*" and "*We would be happy if she wanted to come back in the future*". A number of employers even offered future references or invited students to return, reflecting the lasting impression they made.

These placements have not only enabled students to gain practical experience across sectors including engineering, healthcare, education, business, finance, technology, events, construction, marketing and the voluntary sector, but have also helped them develop the confidence, professionalism and employability skills that will support them in their future education and careers. We are incredibly proud of every student for the way they represented Lymm Sixth Form and would like to thank all of our employer partners for their generosity, encouragement and continued support in making this invaluable programme such a success.

Year 11 to Sixth Form students, start thinking about.....

At Lymm Sixth Form, Year 12 students take part in a dedicated Work Experience Week during the summer term. We introduce this as part of our Futures Programme in the first term, as many top placements are filled up a year in advance. Work experience helps students explore careers, build skills, gain confidence, and strengthen university or apprenticeship applications. Most importantly, it supports informed decisions about the future. If you have a career in mind, start exploring opportunities now. If you're unsure, the Futures Programme is here to guide you. We've listed several high-quality placements below and overleaf: check them out, note the deadlines and start your own research. It's never too early to start thinking about!

Engineering and STEM Placements

- **BAE Systems Engineering Taster Week** gives students real engineering project exposure: ideal for those interested in aerospace/defence.
- **Sellafield Ltd – Risley (Warrington)**
These 1-week placements cover business, ICT and engineering.
- **STFC Daresbury Laboratory**
Regularly hosts student placements in physics and engineering.

University and Research Lab Experience

- **Liverpool John Moores University** – [Astrophysics Work-Experience Week](#). A summer insight into astrophysics research.
- **The University of Manchester** offers a range of work experience placements, including opportunities at the University Library and STEM research placements for Year 12 students through programmes like In2STEM and STEM Learning. Students can also explore NHS-related work experience via the Greater Manchester NHS Careers and Engagement Hub.
- **Francis Crick Institute Lab Placements**. 1-week lab-based or shadowing placements for 14–19 year olds in advanced biomedical research. Applications open on a rolling basis. London-based, so difficult logistically unless you have family down there.

Insight Programmes in Finance, Law & Tech

- **KPMG Discovery Programme**. A work experience for students in auditing, tax, advisory and tech, open to Year 12 preparing for advanced pathways.
- **Pinsent Mason's Summer Work Experience**. A week-long legal placement in Manchester or virtual, perfect for those exploring law careers.

- **Warrington & Halton Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust**. Face-to-face 'Aspire to be...' programmes for Doctors, Allied Health Professionals, Nurses/Midwives and Admin roles at Warrington or Halton Hospital.

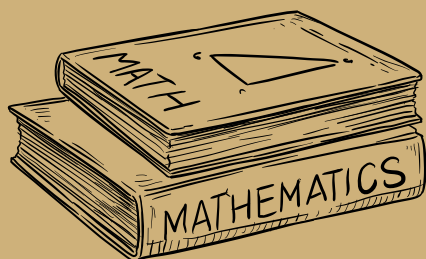
Through this programme, you could:

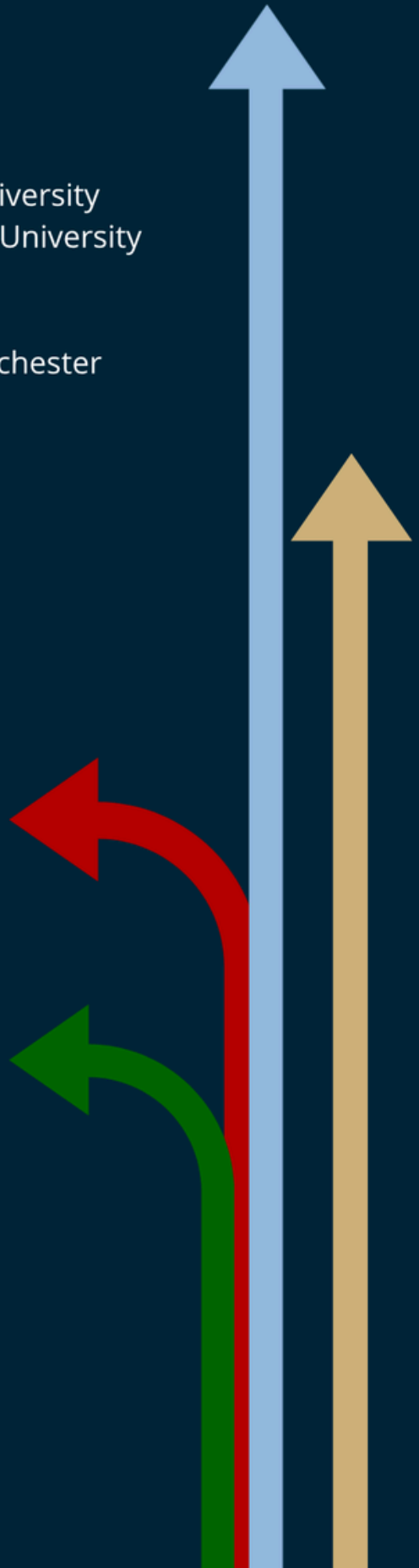
